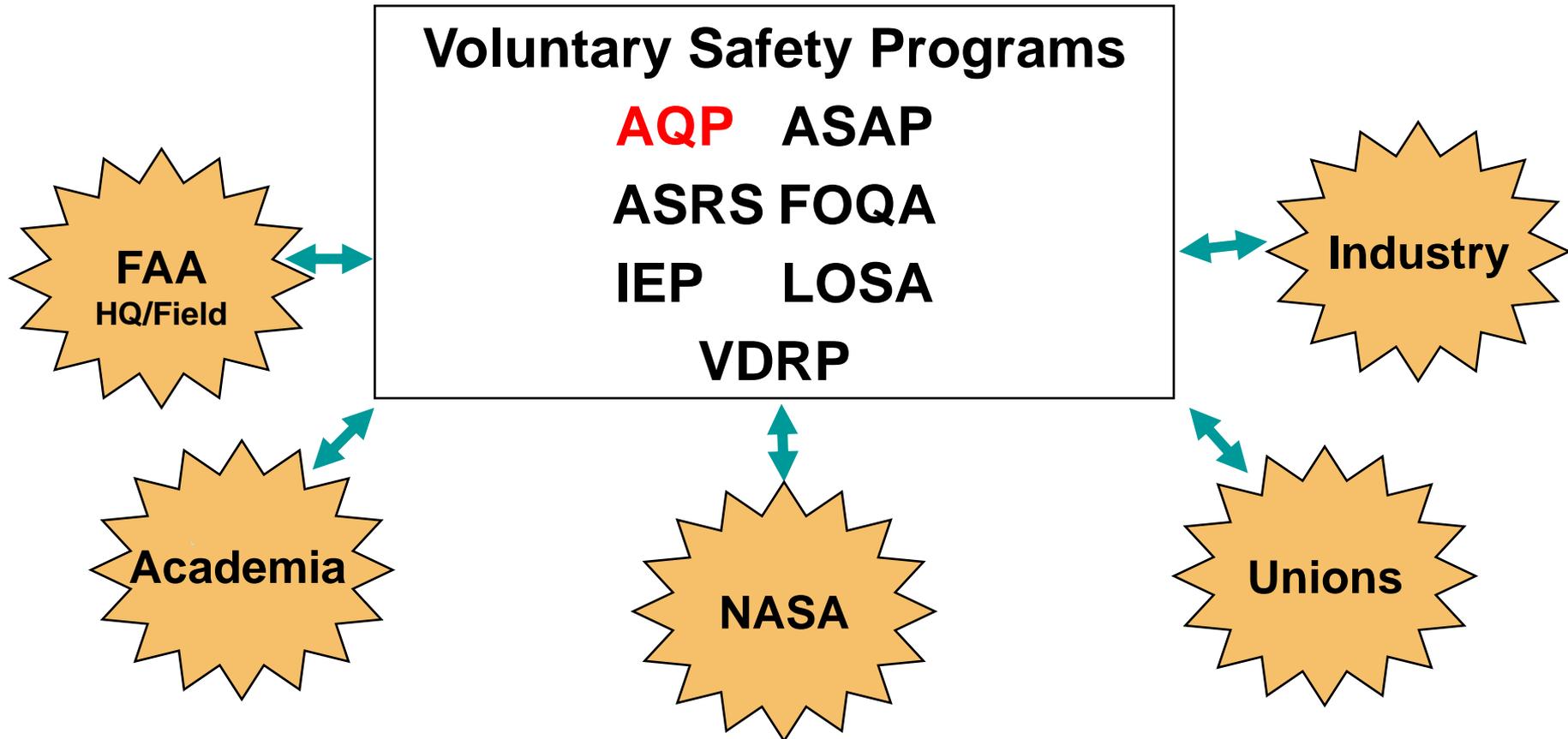

AQP Today

- **Mainstream training program**
 - Today, 75% of Part 121 pilots and flight attendants are either in or transitioning to AQP. This represents 29 air carriers: 29 with pilot programs, 11 with flight attendant programs and 4 with dispatch programs.
 - Large air carriers (1,000 pilots or more), the percentage of pilots participating is just under 90%

Aviation Rulemaking Committees

- **Air Carrier Safety and Pilot Training**
 - AQP – “Best Practice” Changing environment presents an ongoing challenge to maintain, if not improve, training that ensures flight crew proficiency is commensurate with safety
 - AQP provides a consistent structure that can accommodate change
- **Flightcrew Member Training Hours Requirement Review**
 - AQP provides the best current method for training, assessing, and validating flightcrew members for commercial air carrier operations

FAA

- **FAA Order 8900.1 - The Flight Standards Service (FSS) encourages air carriers to participate**
 - The AQP methodology directly supports the FAA's goals for safety enhancement.
 - AQP provides for enhanced curriculum development and a data driven approach to quality assurance along with the flexibility to target critical tasks during training

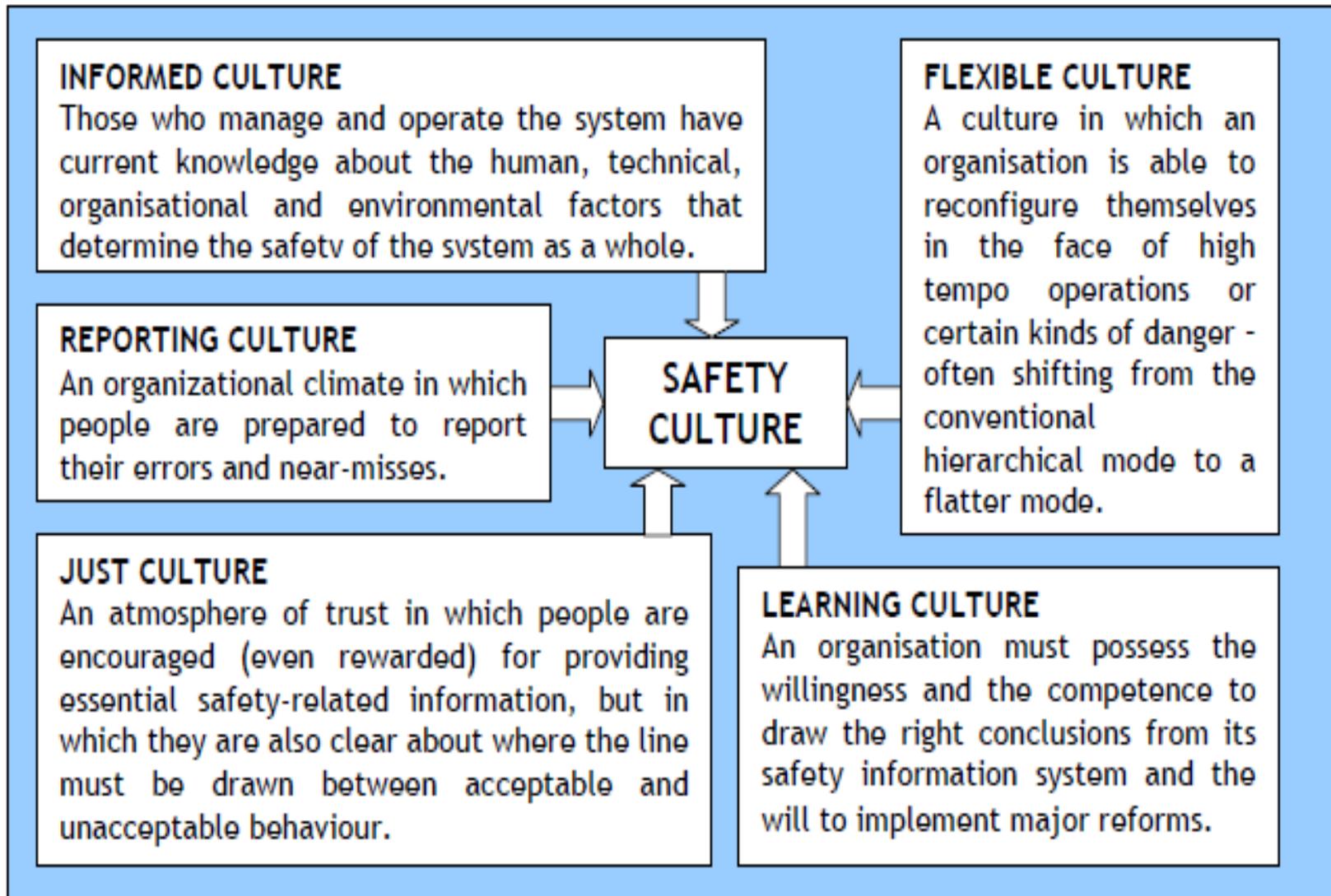


Paradigm Shift – Risk Management

- **Safety Management System (SMS)**
 - Measuring, mitigating and managing risk, not just safety events
 - Process definition of safety to accompany product definition...beyond regulatory compliance
 - Regulations as risk controls
- **Voluntary Safety Programs (VSP)**
 - Incentives
 - Trust
 - Information Protection

AQP - Systems Perspective

- **Frames training regulations as risk controls**
- **Allows alternative risk controls with approval of FAA Extended Review Team (ERT):**
 - Principal Operations Inspector (POI)
 - FAA Manager of AQP



Caution

- **Do not fall victim to current program dogma**
 - AC 120-54A: The methods and procedures in this AC describe one acceptable means of compliance. Alternate means are encouraged and will be evaluated on their merit.

- **Documents**
 - Program Audit Data Base (PADB)
 - Required AQP Documentation
- **Data**
 - Performance Proficiency Data Base (PPDB)
 - De-identified student data
 - Identified instructor/evaluator data
 - Other Sources – ASAP/FOQA/LOSA
- **Dialogue**
 - Extended Review Team (ERT)
 - FAA/Management/Labor Partnership
